Hope's Health Corner

"After everyone was full, Jesus told his disciples, 'Now gather the leftovers, so that nothing is wasted.'" John 6:12

Remember the story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 with five loaves and two fish? Have you wondered what the disciples did with all the leftovers – something like twelve baskets of bread pieces and two fish? With no Frigidaire or Tupperware, what did they do with all that food?

Here we are in the time of year when friends and family give thanks together. Whether you cook a Thanksgiving meal, or pick up a to-go order, you're likely to end up with leftovers too! The leftovers, however, could be a danger if not handled correctly. Consider these tips for safe handling:

- Remember the two-hour rule: All perishable items should be refrigerated within two hours of coming out of the oven or refrigerator. Keeping them out longer than two hours will lead the food to enter the "danger zone" (between 40-140°F) where bacteria can multiply quickly and cause the food to become unsafe.
- Use small and shallow containers. Shallow containers help cool down leftovers faster and help them escape the "danger zone" more quickly.
- Freeze or consume within <u>four</u> days. Use the Monday after Thanksgiving as a reminder that it's the last day you can safely eat leftovers. If you want to keep them for longer, freeze them within the four-day period to enjoy later.
- Microwave food safely. When reheating food in the microwave, be sure to rotate the food for even heating. Microwaves have cold spots, so it is wise to check the internal temperature of your food in several spots to make sure your meats/fish are reheated to the proper temperature.

This month, continue to place your trust in God that He will provide. After Jesus blessed the food in the story of the 5,000, it was passed around and everyone ate their fill until they were full. The food was not portioned or rationed; the baskets were overflowing, all to show that God provides abundantly for his people. He takes our small offerings and multiplies them to be fruitful for all, for his glory.




